

A More Excellent Way

The Original Apostolic Gospel

No person is exactly at the same level of understanding as anyone else in their walk with God. That is why God says in His Word things like:

2 Timothy 2:15 Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

Romans 1:17 For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, "The just shall live by faith."

Acts 18:24 thru 26 And a certain Jew named Apollos, born in Alexandria, an eloquent man, and mighty in scriptures, came to Ephesus. This man was instructed in the way of the Lord, being fervent in spirit, he spake and taught diligently the things of the Lord, knowing only the baptism of John. And he began to speak boldly in the synagogue: whom when Aquila and Priscilla had heard, they took him unto them, and expounded unto him the way of God more perfectly.

Hosea 4:6 My people are destroyed for the lack of Knowledge;...

No matter how much we think we know about God's Word and the world around us – God says:

1 Corinthians 13:12 For now we see through a glass darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then I shall know even as also I am known.

1 Corinthians 8:2 And if any man think that he knoweth anything he knoweth nothing yet as he ought to know.

Some might say, “Well, I know the Bible and I know what the Gospel is – I don’t need any one to tell me any thing about it.” There is a scripture that says:

Proverbs 18:13 He that answereth a matter before he heareth it, it is a folly unto him.

So what is the point of all this preamble? I have noticed that no church has the *Gospel of Jesus Christ as practiced by the Apostles* as part of their statement of faith nor as their actual practice.

But a lot of people search the scriptures every day and this has been going on for centuries – how could they miss it?

Because they are not actually searching the scriptures but corrupt translations of the scriptures. The Devil has made certain that any key scripture having to do with salvation will be misleading in the translation. Satan however has not changed the original Hebrew Codex. Well at least, not yet.

If we all had Bibles that were free of intentional translation errors or could read the original Hebrew or Greek we would all be on a level playing field. However that is not the case. Most of us cannot read Hebrew or Greek – nor are we interested in learning. This is the shameful state of Christianity today.

I have offered to teach Hebrew to my fellow church brethren but sadly no one has shown any interest in actually being able to read the word of God. And their eternal life depends on it.

Is there anyway for anyone to truly know what God said in His Word? Yes, but you must meet God's qualifications.

You must have a contrite heart.

You must come to Him as a little child.

You must be repentant.

You must hunger after truth.

You must hunger after His righteousness.

If you think you know it all – you will be shocked and disillusioned at the end of your existence here upon the earth.

So where are we then – what can I do to convey God's plan of salvation to you. If I tell you what God said – you would tell me I was wrong because your Bible translation says something entirely different.

If I try to explain the meaning of the Hebrew or Greek words, you won't trust me because your translation is dead wrong and some entries in the concordances are skewed.

Only the Holy Spirit of God can lead you into all truth. It took God 49 years of pointing the truth out to me before he opened my understanding to what I was looking at in the scripture. I had always felt like the richest person in the world because he had given me more scriptures on salvation than anyone else I knew. But God didn't open my understanding

until September of 2021. Before that I was looking at the actual meaning of the scripture in my own sermons but I couldn't connect the dots to see the big picture.

When I did see what God was telling me I tried to share it with my friends, loved ones and other preachers. I tried to share with everyone I met. I had found the treasure in the field and gave up everything to buy the field in order to own that treasure. But no one was listening.

After I had presented the Gospel to them – the preachers either avoided me or ignored me. They loved the status quo more than the quest for truth and all its benefits and of course persecutions that come with it. They seem to prefer a transient peace rather than eternal prosperity with God.

When I look around – I see the church stuck in a rut. Sometimes now and then the Holy Spirit really moves in our worship services but I have never seen it as good as the first few years that I was in the church. I was young and inexperienced then. I was on fire for God – but trapped beneath a glass lid that would only permit us to go so far.

Today the possibilities are endless knowing how to get to the marriage feast of the Lamb. But it seems no one cares – no one is listening but God and his angels.

Would you like to hear the actual Gospel that Peter preached on the Day of Pentecost? Would you like to have a chance to decide for yourself whether these things are true? Would you like to hear what God actually said about salvation?

Many people know what the Holy Spirit is like. They can feel it: it renews our bodies minds, souls and spirits. Some people actually have the baptism of the Holy Spirit and some enjoy the gifts of the Spirit also.

But if you have the Holy Spirit in you or on you it is God's grace in your life because you haven't done your part to earn it yet. God has only promised the Holy Spirit to those who have taken His name in water baptism when they have repented of their sins. Acts 2:38

Can you get to heaven by just having the Holy Spirit in your life? Jesus gave a parable about someone who came to the wedding feast and did not have the wedding garment on. He was removed and cast into outer darkness. That robe of righteousness can only be obtained by taking His name in water baptism.

Remember in John 3:5 Jesus said, *“Verily, Verily, I say unto thee, Except a man is born again of the water AND of the Spirit he cannot enter the kingdom of God.”* Both are required for entrance into His kingdom.

“Well,” you say, “I was already baptized in such and such a church.” There are no churches that follow the minimum requirements for baptism as outlined in God's Word. This situation is mentioned in the Bible where people had already been baptized by John but were required to be baptized again by taking the name of Jesus in another baptism.

Is there a scripture that tells us what to do when we are baptized? The answer is: no. You must simultaneously obey several scriptures when you are baptized. Some are in the Old Testament and some are in the New Testament.

Peter was given the keys to the kingdom of God by Jesus. He was the one to which God gave the understanding to connect all the dots in order to preach the first sermon on salvation. And he did a wonderful Job. Then, “What is the problem.” you might ask.

Satan has corrupted the translation of a specific verb in the salvation scriptures in order to create some vague meaningless statement that’s neither true nor effectual.

What is the mistranslation?

Why its in Romans 10:13, Acts 2:21 and Joel 2:32.

For whosoever *shall call upon* the name of the LORD shall be saved.

This statement is found nowhere in the original Hebrew or Greek Word of God. For example, God said in John 9:31 Now we know that God heareth not sinners. But the above three verses state *whosoever* meaning anyone could call on the name of the LORD and get saved. This is ridiculous.

What then did it say?

In other words you must take the name of the LORD when you are baptized – you must actually be named with His name.

As you may have heard – no scripture is of private interpretation. Are there any other scriptures to back this up? I'm glad you asked. Here are a few from the KJV.

2nd Chronicles 7:14 *If my people, which are called by my name, ...* When are God's people called by God's name – except in baptism?

Exodus 20:7 *Thou shalt not **take** the name of the LORD thy God in vain;...* The word take in this sentence does not mean to speak – it means to pick up and carry and to bear.

Acts 15:17 *That residue of men might seek after the Lord, and all the Gentiles, upon whom my name is called, saith the Lord, who doeth all these things.*

There are many other references that I could use from the original Greek but they are corrupted in your translation of the Bible and you would have no way of knowing if I were telling you the truth.

The key word in the Hebrew is Yikra which almost always means to name – it does not usually mean to call out or to summon. It is what Adam did to the animals – he named them. This is the word used in Joel 2:32 on page 7, line 4. Of the first 25 times the word Yikra is used in the Bible 23 mean to name.

When the word Yikra from this verse was translated into the Greek language in the Septuagint – the proper Greek word was used. This word was even more precise than the Hebrew.

This word in the Greek Language is epikaleo. It means to name it does not mean to summon – that word is eiskaleo. It does not mean to call out – that word is kaleo without any prefixes.

Epikaleo is the word that is used in the Greek in Romans 10:13 What God said in this verse was, *For whosoever shall be named with the name of the Lord shall be saved.*

Acts 2:21 says exactly the same thing in the original Greek. *And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall be named with the name of the Lord shall be saved.*

This is the key verse of what Peter was preaching on the Day of Pentecost. But no one ever heard it in English because the translators were very corrupt and so Christians have been kept in the dark for hundreds of years.

Would you like to take the name of your savior and your God?

You can obey the gospel and fulfill the scripture by:

Learning who Jesus is.

Repenting of all your sins.

Being immersed under water while

Being given the name of Jesus and

Having your sins remitted by the baptizer.

Then God has promised to give you the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
